

6 Ways to Promote the Arts By Dawn M. Wayand

We are all trying to get our works out there for the public to see and to possibly buy and sometimes it is difficult to get your foot in the door or to even get started. Below are 6 ways to begin to promote the arts – your art – and hopefully to get successful at it. If you can try a few of these tips, you may just find yourself with that foot in the door and making money.

- Develop relationships with neighborhood shops and restaurants. Sometimes shops and restaurants will put your works on consignment as they need artwork in their place of businesses for decoration. Put a price on the pieces and you just might sell something to someone who is intrigued by your style.
- Get involved in your art organization newsletters. If you have an upcoming show or know of any call-to-artist opportunities, share it with your newsletter's editor so that they may include it in the newsletter. If everyone is sharing call-to-artist information, there will be more opportunities available to you as well.
- If you are involved in an art organization and that organization offers an Artist of the Month opportunity, sign up for it. People are often excited to meet the artist behind the masterpieces he/she creates.
- Get involved in the Hillsborough County Artists Table. Bring your art resume, business cards and a photo book that represents your art. This is a great opportunity to network with other artists and find out about upcoming opportunities.
- Get involved in art organizations and galleries. Go to the meetings. Your feedback and suggestions at those meeting are invaluable to the board members who run those organizations.
- If you have an event coming up, send an email out to all of your contacts including contacts within your art organizations. This helps to promote YOUR art.



8 Things You Didn't Know About Marilyn Plummer - Interview by Dawn Waylan

Hometown: Staten Island, New York / She has lived in Tampa Bay Since 1974

Media: Acrylics and sometimes watercolor

DW: How do you know when a piece is finished? MP: It used to be when I signed my name on my paintings but now I sometimes go back and touch up my paintings after they are signed just because I have new thoughts and ideas to add.

DW: What do you hope your art will accomplish? MP: I would love for my pieces to fall in the hands of someone who wants to hang it in their home. That is the most satisfying part of my work and what keeps me producing.

DW: Do you consider yourself a professional or an amateur? MP: I think I fall somewhere in between. I feel I am a professional because I have been producing for 50 years and have over 1,700 pieces on hand, however, sometimes I feel like an amateur because it is hard to make a living as an artist.

DW: How has art helped you in life? MP: I cannot imagine my life without art. It has pulled me out of depressive cycles. It gives me a lot of joy in my life as well as a purpose.

DW: How long does it take you to produce a piece? MP: It can take anywhere from a couple of hours to several days.

DW: Did you find it hard to break into the art scene? MP: I honestly do not feel like I have broken into the art scene yet. I love to paint but I am just learning of new resources to get my work shown.

From the very beginning, painting has been a gift for Marilyn. She gets so much peace and joy from producing works and it has been her best form of communicating her feelings. Many years ago, she discovered that painting flowers was a great anti-depressant – the deeper the depression, the more vibrant the florals. Getting it out is far better than holding it in. Painting has also helped her to get in touch with her Creator. When she finds materials and canvases to paint on, she realizes God is supplying her needs and she is grateful.
